Disabled Persons Railcards (DPRCs)

About the data

The Disabled Persons Railcard (DPRC) enables disabled passengers to get a discount of a third off adult rail fares for travel on the National Rail network in Great Britain. More information about this railcard can be found on the [disabled persons railcard website](#).

ORR collects this data as part of its [Accessible Travel Policy \(ATP\)](#) compliance monitoring.

Definitions:

DPRCs in circulation: The number of disabled persons railcards in *circulation* which are valid to use for a discount on rail fares. This includes both one-year and three-year railcards.

DPRCs issued: The number of disabled persons railcards that have been *issued* during the year. DPRCs can be either for one-year or three-year in length.

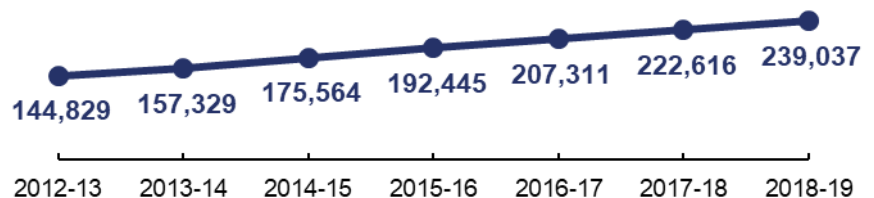

There were 239,037 Disabled Persons Railcards (DPRCs) in circulation at the end of 2018-19

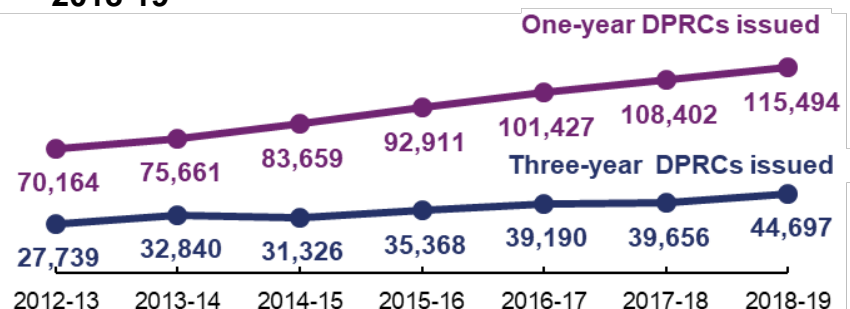
This represents an increase of 7.4% compared with 2017-18

In 2018-19, there were **115,494 one-year DPRCs issued** (an increase of 6.5% from 2017-18) and **44,697 three-year DPRCs issued** (an increase of 12.7% from 2017-18)
